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Section 5.7 Spatial Allocation	<p>Specifically, Coastal Policies 7 (Integrated Approach) and 8 (Spatial Planning)</p> <p><i>The existing policies and actions are focused on case-by-case instances of spatial allocation e.g. decisions relating to a new structure.</i></p> <p><i>A lot has changed in the eight years since the Te Awanui IMP was released.</i></p> <p><i>The new Spatial Planning provisions relate to:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>(1) managing conflicting uses and values</i> <i>(2) recognising the relationship between Tauranga Moana Iwi and the environment</i> <i>(3) involving Tauranga Moana Iwi</i> <i>(4) managing effects on special places including mahinga kai areas.</i> <p><i>New tools are now available – co-governance/co-management, statutory acknowledgement areas, takutai moana act, marine spatial planning.</i></p> <p><i>As a result, this topic has been widened to recommend/require/support a new marine spatial plan for Tauranga Moana¹. Marine spatial planning is a new tool, currently in use within the Hauraki Gulf.</i></p> <p><i>Some of the existing policies and actions have been relocated to other topic areas:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Structures – Policy 16 • Aquaculture – Policy 23 • Mapping of significant sites – Policy 32
